Day One - Dresden & Wiscasset

- Each garden below is open from 10-2 on Friday, June 30, 2023.
- Please present a print copy of ticket or be prepared to show ticket on your phone for entry to each stop on the tour.
- Watch for parking signs and follow directions from parking volunteers.
- Two gardens on Federal Street are "walk by" sites. Please view from the sidewalk.

200 Common Rd, Dresden

These gardens were created out of brambles left behind after trees were harvested. Includes fruit trees, perennial gardens, and an annual 'starburst' garden. *Park on road, look for signs*

Pownalborough Court House 23 Courthouse Drive, Dresden

A lovely re-creation of an 18th century garden overlooking the Kennebec River featuring a grape arbor alongside perennial and herb gardens.

***Plus: baked goods from Persephone's Pastries, garden book sale, and basket raffle

12 High Street, Wiscasset

You'll love this lush in-town garden behind the 1804 Carlton House featuring spectacular old plantings. *On street parking only.*

Sunken Garden Corner of Main & Federal Streets, Wiscasset

This unique island of serenity in mid-town Wiscasset was created in the foundation of a building that burned in 1903 and is maintained by the Garden Club of Wiscasset. Across from Nickels-Sortwell House. *Park on Federal Street.*

Nickels-Sortwell House 121 Main St., Wiscasset

The garden beds at the front of and behind the house were restored to 1930s style by the Garden Club of Wiscasset. You'll see lovely-scented old fashioned shrub roses at the front of the house, and the back gardens have a mixture of perennials and annuals. *Across from Sunken Garden. Park on Federal Street.*

73 Federal Street, Wiscasset "Walk by" site

This cheerful garden of perennials in sunshine yellow accented with periwinkle blue evolves with the summer in a continuing display of blooms. *Park in school parking lot. View from sidewalk, please.*

2 Morton Street, Wiscasset "Walk by" site

This walk by property has beautiful pink Bonita and Bonica roses covering the fence surrounding the front of the property. *Park in school parking lot. View from sidewalk, please.*

48 Bayview Heights, Wiscasset

This charming rural setting features abundant gardens, a chicken house, and a small pond the owner created herself last year. *Parking near the house.*

Proceeds from Gardens of Lincoln County will support the ongoing work of Lincoln County Historical Association to collect, preserve, and interpret the history of Lincoln County, Maine.

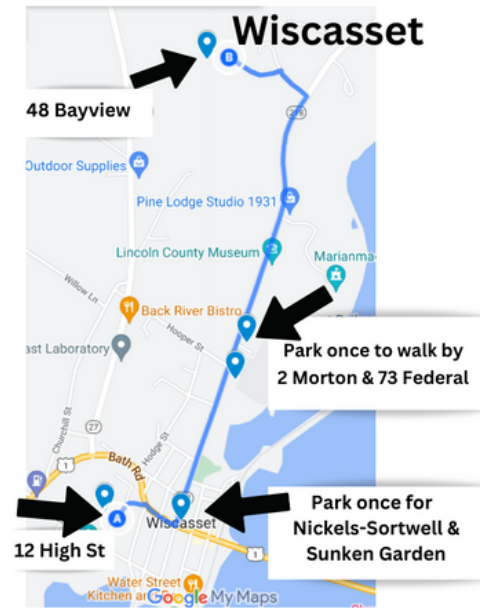
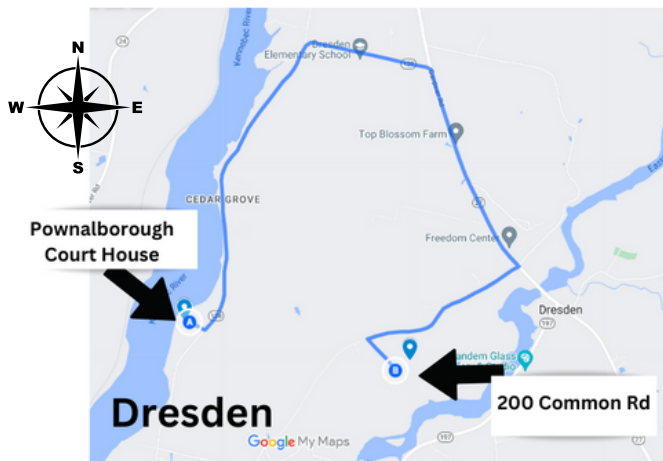
Route Suggestions for Day One
